GENRE: Drama

SYNOPSIS: Three teenagers start a small group Bible study, which turns out to be a disaster when gossip creeps in.

DIRECTOR'S TIP: In order to make it very clear that these are the same three women growing up, you may wish to dress each character in the same color shirt for each of their "ages". Dialogue should flow easily from one table to the next, giving the appearance of growing older. **TIME:** Over 5 minutes

TOPIC: Youth, Gossip

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: Romans 15:14

CHURCH YEAR SEASON: Any

SUGGESTED USE: Worship Service, Women's Event, Seeker Service

CHARACTERS:

KATE 1 - teenage girl ANNA 1 - teenage girl KELLY 1 - teenage girl KATE 2 - female, age 30-40ish ANNA 2 - female, age 30-40ish KELLY 2 - female, age 30-40ish KATE 3 - female, age 50-60ish ANNA 3 - female, age 50-60ish KELLY 3 - female, age 50-60ish

PROPS: 3 tables, Bibles, notebooks, pens, soda/coffee/tea cups if desired

COSTUMES: Modern dress

SOUND: Three or nine wireless microphones; three table microphones

LIGHTING: General stage

SETTING: A small group Bible study

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Lights up.

KATE 3: (Walking in front of the tables, and meeting KATE 1 in the middle of the stage) In retrospect, I think how simple it would have been to say something then. Stop the cycle, you know. What was I thinking? It all began...

KATE 1 & 3: (*Together*)...in high school.

KATE 3 sits down, while KATE 1 takes over.

KATE 1: A few friends and I decided to start this small group Bible study thing. I was so excited! I showed up with my Bible, my pen, my notebook, and high hopes. I couldn't wait to grow, in the Lord and in my friendships both. I realized quickly this might not be that place.

KATE 1: Hey guys, what's up?

ANNA 1: Hey, Kate, how ya doing?

KATE 1: Good, thanks.

KELLY 1: Did you get your lesson done?

ANNA 1: Yea, I did. You know, I just love that scripture they talked about on page... (*Fumbling through her lesson*)

KELLY 1: (*Interrupting*) I had the craziest week. I didn't finish my lesson, needless to say. Well, I actually never got started. You remember Josh, the guy that works at Baskin Robbins? He called last Tuesday and wanted me to meet him after work.

ANNA 1: Are you serious? How old is he?

KELLY 1: Eighteen, I think.

ANNA 1: What did you do?

KELLY 1: I said no! Have you seen the shoes that guy wears? I wouldn't be caught dead...
