Both look around, waiting for the service to start.

**IDA:** I wonder when they're going to start the service.

LOUISE: (Daydreaming) I wonder if I can have Hazel's shoes.

**IDA:** Louise! What a horrible thing to say!

**LOUISE:** Oops! I thought I was just thinking that. I didn't mean to say it out loud.

**IDA:** Well, keep your thoughts to yourself.

**LOUISE:** Really Ida, it's not so bad. Hazel and I are both size eights, and she always chose shoes with great arches.
