**GENRE:** Comedy

**DIRECTOR'S TIP:** The narrator should be a bubbly storyteller whose day is ruined. The first two pigs act very cartoon-like as well, until the third pig comes in, cool and level-headed, and turns the story on its head.

*The Narrator sits on stage, reading from a giant storybook.*

**NARR:** The second pig built his house out of sticks.

**NARR:** And the third little piggy was the smartest of all. He built his house out of--

*Ned enters stage right.*

**NED:** Excuse me, Miss Narrator, but could I have a moment with my piggy pals?

**NARR:** Uhh, we're kind of on a schedule here. We have a lesson to get to after this, so I--

**NED:** Sorry, I don't mean to hog the spotlight.

**NARR:** Hog the spotlight?

**NED:** Sorry, it's what we call a pig pun.

**DUSTY:** Hahahaha, hog the spotlight, I get it. That's a good one.

**NED:** Fellas, focus here. Look, you know what's going on. The wolf's gonna come along, blow your houses down, and make you both dead.

**LUCKY:** He is?

**NED:** He is, unless you listen to me.

**DUSTY:** Pig pun! I get that too! Was that a joke too?

**NED:** Yes, it was, now listen! Why are we building our own houses? Let's build one together! Let's take your sticks to make our frame, and let's use your straws to make bricks, and let's build a house that's stronger than straw or sticks!
