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Lights up on an art gallery. CUSTOMER enters and a GALLERY ATTENDANT approaches.

ATTENDANT: (Arrogantly) May I help you?

CUSTOMER: (Indecisive) Oh, I'm not sure. I'm really just looking I think.

ATTENDANT: (Condescending) Is this your first visit to the gallery?

CUSTOMER: (*Innocent*) Yes, I've been thinking about a large painting for my family room.

ATTENDANT: (*Patiently*) What exactly were you looking for?

CUSTOMER: (Unsure) I don't know. I guess I'll know when I see it.

ATTENDANT: (*Probing*) Is there a particular artist you had in mind?

CUSTOMER: No, I'm not very good with names.

ATTENDANT: Are you looking for something modern or traditional?

CUSTOMER: I think both.

ATTENDANT: (*Pompous*) I see. Well, perhaps you would be interested in a Guystan. (*Pointing to a painting*) His work has been described as fresh, tantalizing and yet hinted with archaic movement, which comes through in the brushwork.

CUSTOMER: (Honest) I find it a bit dizzying.

ATTENDANT: Then perhaps this one. (Almost boastful) This piece is my favorite. It is called Primitive Man and demonstrates the strength of ...

CUSTOMER: (Interrupts with obvious distaste) No, I don't think so.

ATTENDANT: (Slightly offended) Then perhaps a Jacobean. Her style is more grounded, using subtleties of color and line to enhance mood.

CUSTOMER: (Quickly) No, that's perhaps too subtle.

ATTENDANT: Here's a lovely piece. (Pointing)

CUSTOMER: (Shaking head) Too colorful.

ATTENDANT: I know the perfect piece. (*Presents piece*)

CUSTOMER: (Interrupting) Too angular.

ATTENDANT: (*Trying yet another piece*) Perhaps this might appeal to you?
