**GENRE:** Comedy

synopsis: Often we confuse tithing and gifts. On Christmas morning, two children learn the difference between a tithe (giving back what is God's) and a gift (giving to Godfrom what is ours).

**DIRECTOR'S TIP:** Comedic

timing is important, but "comedic revealing" is just as important in a prop-heavy piece. Many times actors will perform a comedy and not understand why the audience didn't laugh at points in the script which they were sure were hilarious. Nine times out of ten it's because they mumbled the end of their line, or blocked a character on stage whose facial expression was supposed to be the punch line of a joke. As a director, you must be aware of these types of technicalities or you'll lose out on the greatest impact possible for your comedy. All but DAD are seated in front of the Christmas tree, opening gifts.
