### **GENRE:** Comedy

**SYNOPSIS:** How often have you said, "This is too good to be true?" Our modern society is leery of anything that seems to come too easily. CLERK— the distributor of grace. Any age. CUSTOMER— the hoarder of grace. Any age.

PROPS: Table, store sign, duster, bottles of water, wig, ski mask, gun

**COSTUMES:** Modern dress

**SOUND:** 2 wireless mics

LIGHTING: General stage

SETTING: Store

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CLERK dusts the counter, whistling happily to himself. Customer enters, a bit nervous, on edge.

CLERK: Good morning. Can I help you?

CUSTOMER: Wh...what do you sell here?

CLERK proudly displays sign that says, "Grace R Us."

**CLERK:** Grace. We sell nothing but grace.

**CUSTOMER:** Grace? Grace who? Grace Kelly? Do you sell her movies like To Catch a Thief?

CLERK: No. Just grace.

**CUSTOMER:** You mean those prayers before you eat? "God is great. God is good. Let us thank him for this food"? Do you get royalties every time someone prays those?

**CLERK:** No. But you're close. Grace is forgiveness and love.

CUSTOMER thinks about that for a second.

CUSTOMER: Well, I could use some that.

**CLERK:** Great.

**CUSTOMER:** I'll take a bottle of it.

CLERK: A bottle?
