DAD: I guess that shouldn't surprise me. Well, maybe it's better she's not here.

EMILY: What are you doing?

DAD: Packing the last of my stuff.

EMILY: (Pause) When will I see you again?

DAD: Emily, we've already been over this a dozen times. The first weekend of every month you and Adam will spend with me. I'll be back in two weeks to pick you up.

EMILY: (Pause) Will your girlfriend be with you?

DAD: She has a name.

EMILY: Sorry, will Karen be in the car when you pick me up?

DAD: I don't know. Maybe, maybe not. I'm sure the two of you will become good friends once you've spent some time together and ...

EMILY: I don't want to spend time with your friends.

DAD: Listen, I don't want to get into an argument with you. Okay?

EMILY: Okay! (*Pause*) So what are you throwing out? (*Starts to look through trash bag*)

DAD: Old books and clothes. Stuff I haven't read or worn in years. Stuff that won't fit in my apartment.

EMILY: This shirt looks brand-new.

DAD: Too small.
