GENRE: Comedy

SYNOPSIS: A young woman dating a boy who literally acts like a dog is encouraged by a friend to demand better in relationships.

DIRECTOR'S TIP: This script will be lots of fun—for the actors and the audience alike. But as with all scripts that have lots of physical humor-here, Roy being played as a cute, cuddly dog-you need to be careful not to overdo it. If the focus becomes the physical humor, that's all the audience will remember. Weeks after the performance, people will come to your actor and say, "I loved that drama where you were the dog. You were so funny!" And if you ask them what the point of the script was, they'll have no clue. So the onus is on you as director to keep the actor playing Roy from stealing the show. LEAH: Oh look! Here he comes now! Here comes my boy.

ROY enters, running and barking like a dog. He runs circles around LEAH as she talks.

LEAH: There's my big strong boyfriend. Yes, he loves his little girlfriend, doesn't he? Yes! Give us a hug.

ROY gets on his haunches so LEAH can hug him.

LEAH: Roy, say hi to my best friend, Shari.

SHARI holds out her hand to shake. ROY sniffs her hand, turns his nose up and growls.

LEAH: Sorry, he's just a little protective of me. It's okay, sweetie, we've been friends a long time. She's a nice girl.

ROY growls louder.

SHARI: So...this is your boyfriend.

LEAH: Yes. We've been together three wonderful weeks. Haven't we?

ROY rubs his head against LEAH for attention. LEAH pets him.

LEAH: Yes, I love you too. Here, have a treat.

LEAH gives ROY a treat.
