CHUCK is on the side of the stage.

We were expecting a good one between the visiting Giants and the hometown Sluggers, but for some reason, the Sluggers have not yet taken the field. I'm told our roving reporter, Tricia Banks, is in the Sluggers dugout. Tricia? Maybe you can shed some light on this story.

TRICIA enters.

**TRICIA:** Chuck, I'm here in the dugout where the Sluggers are waiting and ready to get the game under way.

**CHUCK:** Tricia, did you say they're ready to play?

TRICIA: Well, they're in uniform, and they have all their gloves and bats ready.

**CHUCK:** So what's the hold up?

**TRICIA:** Maybe one of the players can explain that better than I can. Excuse me, can I have a word with you for our television audience?

ERIC enters.

ERIC: Who, me?

**TRICIA:** Your name, please?

**ERIC:** Uh, Eric. Am I really on TV?

TRICIA: Yes you are.

**ERIC:** Hi, Mom!

**TRICIA:** Eric, our audience is very excited to get this game under way.

**ERIC:** We're very excited too. The Giants are tough, but we think that we can pull together and come out on top.

**TRICIA:** Eric, I have to ask you, if you're so eager to play the Giants, why haven't you taken the field?

**ERIC:** Well, we can't take the field yet.

**TRICIA:** Why not? You have your uniforms on. You have your glove.

**ERIC:** I know, but we're waiting for the starters to show up.
