THE WEISSMANS (CHRISTMAS ON WOODWARD, PART 3)

GENRE: Drama

synopsis: Part Three (of Four) depicting the 3 "wisemen" of the modern day Nativity story, which takes place in an underprivileged community. Each church will change those names to customize them to its own church's neighborhoods/cities/states.

DIRECTOR'S TIP: Behind an upstage scrim is a boiler room where we see silhouettes of life-size cutouts of Mary, Joseph, the Innkeeper and his wife, and a homeless woman (with shopping cart), all huddled around a large toolbox with lid open. There are three gaps in the "huddle" (where eventually this Birmingham family will take their places at the end of this scene).

TIME: Over 5 minutes

CAST BREAKDOWN: 3

TOPIC: Christian Living

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: Matthew 2:1-12

CHURCH YEAR SEASON: Christmas

SUGGESTED USE: #3 of a 4 part series

CHARACTERS:

STEVE Weissman-"Birmingham" husband CINDY Weissman-"Birmingham" wife

DAWN Weissman-teenage or pre-teen daughter of the couple

PROPS: Frozen turkey (still in package), iPod, full shopping bags

COSTUMES: Casual but very upscale clothing

SOUND: Three wireless microphones

LIGHTING: Begins with lighting behind upstage scrim. Moves to general stage lighting once drama begins. Ends with lighting behind scrim again.

SETTING: A city street

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Lights up. In the distance you can see a neon sign that reads "SAV-MOR INN – NO VA-CANCY". Downstage is an outdoor street scene with a street bench, and a street sign that reads "Woodward", where we see STEVE and CINDY squinting up at the Sav-Mor Inn sign with DAWN trailing a bit behind.

CINDY is carrying a large (uncooked/wrapped) turkey, and DAWN is completely disengaged – text-messaging on her cell-phone with Walkman ear-buds in her ears.

CINDY: This can't be right, Steve.

STEVE: It's gotta be. I put the address right into Onstar as the lady from Meals-that-Heal read it to me, and it came up as a valid address. This must be the right place.

CINDY: Onstar? The same Onstar that told me to turn left into Lake Michigan last week?

STEVE: You're not helping.

CINDY: (Points to Sav-Mor sign) This is a motel. They wouldn't send us to a motel...in Detroit...with (Holds up the turkey) an uncooked turkey.

STEVE: What do you suggest I do, Dear?

CINDY: Can't you call the (Looking for the correct term) underprivileged family and ask them their address?

STEVE: (As if ridiculous suggestion) I don't have their phone number. We're bringing them dinner, not adopting them.

CINDY: Then call information. We know they live in Detroit.

STEVE: (A little ashamed) I don't remember their name.

CINDY: (Flabbergasted) You didn't write it down??

STEVE: I was driving when she called—it was easiest to just punch in the address.

CINDY: Then can you call the...Deal-a-Meal people?

STEVE: (Correcting her condescendingly) It's "Meals-That-Heal" and it's late—I'm sure they're closed.

CINDY: C'mon. Let's just go.
