SUGGESTED USE: Sermon illustration

CHARACTERS:

FRED—a selfish employee GRAHAM-Fred's boss

PROPS: Office furnishings

COSTUMES: Business formal

SOUND: Two wireless microphones

LIGHTING: General stage

SETTING: An executive office

DIRECTOR'S TIP: Fred is completely clueless, oblivious to the ludicrous nature of his point of view. Graham is very shrewd

and basically gives Fred the rope to hang himself.





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FRED enters GRAHAM's office.

FRED: Boss, can I have a word with you?

GRAHAM: Certainly, Fred. Have a seat.

FRED: Thank you.

GRAHAM: Something I can help you with?

FRED: I certainly hope so. It's about my job, sir.

GRAHAM: Your job?

FRED: I'm not happy with it.

GRAHAM: You're not?

FRED: No, sir. Frankly, I'm really disappointed.

GRAHAM: How so?

FRED: Well, to be honest, I'm not getting much out of it. I haven't for some time. I gotta be honest, it's a down-right drudgery some days.

GRAHAM: I'm sorry you feel that way. You do know that you're an important part of this company.

FRED: Yes, yes, I've heard it all before. Customer service is the life blood of this business. But rhetoric aside, I feel pretty lifeless. I come in here every day, punch in, sit at my desk, and nothing happens.
