He's trying to remind her gently about the love we have in Christ, but don't make it too obvious. It's written subtly — you don't want to hit your audience over the head with it. Let the pastor make the connection for them in his message if they missed it.

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Scene opens with JESS sitting by herself on a park bench. After a few moments, ADAM ENTERS and walks behind her. He hesitates, realizes JESS is who he thinks she is, and approaches her.

ADAM: Jess? Hey, how're you doing?

JESS: Adam! Hey — what are you doing here?

ADAM: Just out for a walk. It's such a nice day. Do you mind if I join you for a minute?

JESS: Oh, no — sure. Have a seat. It is beautiful. The sun feels good — almost makes you forget it's winter. How have you been?

ADAM: Doing well, thanks. Keeping pretty busy.

JESS: Yeah, I understand that. Work is going well?

ADAM: Well, you know — it's work, but not bad. How's your job?

JESS: Well, you know — it's a job. (*They laugh*) No, things are fine. How are you and Alison?

ADAM: Doing really well, actually. We're going to go see her parents for Christmas.

JESS: Ah, meeting the family?

ADAM: (Sheepishly) Yeah, yeah. But it should be good. What about you? You and Josh —

JESS: Actually, we just broke up.

ADAM: Oh, Jess. I'm sorry. You guys had been together for a while, hadn't you?

JESS: Just about two years. It's been — well, things would be easier if I didn't miss him so much.

ADAM: Can I ask — did he or you —

JESS: I broke it off. I miss him, but we both knew it wasn't right. I mean, knew there wasn't a future.

ADAM: Knowing probably doesn't make it easier.

JESS: Yeah. I keep wondering what if we tried harder, or I gave up this, or he gave up that, but ...
