JAMIE: (confused) Sure you can. It's not exactly tied up with duct tape and chains.

CASEY: No, it's not like that. It's, well, what if God's dream, this gift, for me, what if... it's not what I want? I mean if I open it up and look at it and realize that I don't like it – I can't exactly go exchange it.

JAMIE: How are you going to ever know that if you don't look at it?

CASEY: Actually this isn't the first one of these I've gotten. And last time I did take a peek at it – once.

JAMIE: And...

CASEY: (starts to smile) It was very cool. Really incredible.

JAMIE: (getting a little excited) Yeah, yeah...

CASEY: It was amazing... and exciting.

JAMIE: And – so what did you do with it?

CASEY: (sighs) Nothing.
