#### **GENRE:** Drama

**SYNOPSIS:** A divorcee realizes that she hasn't yet forgiven her ex-husband.

**DIRECTOR'S TIP:** Pacing is important. Keep the dialogue conversational, but don't let the lines between Katie and Beth drag. TIME: Over 5 minutes

**CAST BREAKDOWN:** 3

**TOPIC:** Forgiveness, Divorce

CHURCH YEAR SEASON: Any

SUGGESTED USE: Seeker Service, Singles Service

#### CHARACTERS:

KATIE BETH—Katie's close friend or sister FRANK—Katie's ex-husband

**PROPS:** Stack of clothes and laundry basket

**COSTUMES:** Casual clothing for all characters

SOUND: Three wireless microphones

LIGHTING: General stage

SETTING: Katie's living room

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**KATIE:** (On phone—very friendly—folding and stacking laundry as she speaks) Sounds good. See you then. (Laughs) I promise. Bye. (Hangs up phone)

BETH: (Enters after a five-second or so count) What's so funny?

KATIE: Could you hear laugh me all the way from the bathroom?

**BETH:** Are you kidding? There have been times when I could hear your laugh all the way from the bathroom at my house!

KATIE: I know. It's horrible, isn't it?

BETH: Don't be silly. I love your laugh.

**KATIE:** Liar. You hate my laugh. You think it's obnoxious.

BETH: Only at art museums and funerals—honest. Who was on the phone?

**KATIE:** Frank. He's coming over to pick up the DVD player in a few minutes.

**BETH:** The DVD player?

KATIE: The one from the bedroom. I never use it anyway, so...

**BETH:** Was it in the settlement?

**KATIE:** We didn't get down to that much detail, Beth. I haven't used it once in the eleven months since he moved out, so I told him he could have it.

BETH: Wow. Philip and I divided up the dust bunnies on paper.

**KATIE:** Yeah, well, you and Philip had a much different divorce. (BETH and KATIE continue to fold laundry through most of the drama).

BETH: (Laughs) That's an understatement. Is he joining us for lunch?

**KATIE:** I can ask him to, if you wouldn't mind.

BETH: No, I wouldn't mind at all. I love Frank.

KATIE: (Almost under her breath) Mmm hmm...everyone loves Frank.

BETH: I'm so glad you guys stayed friends; it made it so much easier on all of us.

KATIE: (Basically teasing) Glad I could help.

BETH: You know what I mean. Frank's just such a great guy—
