**COSTUMES:** Nice clothes on BOB and DONNA; they are out for a romantic encounter; waitress uniform

**SOUND:** Three wireless microphones; Escape (The Piña Colada song)

**LIGHTING:** General stage

**SETTING:** A bar called O'Malley's
