BOB - a husband DONNA - BOB's old lady LUCY - a waitress

PROPS: Tables, chairs

COSTUMES: Nice clothes on BOB and DONNA; they are out for a

romantic encounter; waitress uniform

SOUND: Three wireless microphones; Escape (The Piña Colada song)

LIGHTING: General stage

SETTING: A bar called O'Malley's

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BOB sits in a bar called O'Malley's, nervously spinning his wedding ring. LUCY enters.

LUCY: Can I get you something?

BOB: Yeah, a water. No wait, can you get me a Piña Colada?

LUCY: Sure.

BOB: One of those, please,

LUCY: First time having an affair, huh?

BOB: Why do you say that?

LUCY: The way you keep looking at the door. And the way you keep messing with your

wedding ring.

BOB: This? Wedding? No, no, no, this is a... class ring.
