MOTHER AND CHILD REUNION

GENRE: Drama

SYNOPSIS: Expecting to meet her birth mother for the first time, a young woman instead learns her family's history through her grandmother. This sobering reunion explores the generational effect of sin on families.

DIRECTOR'S TIP: Keep this scene simple. There will be a temptation to be very dramatic; instead, let the words speak for themselves. There is a lot of subtext in this scene, so make sure the actors do their homework in creating their inner monologues.

TIME: Over 5 minutes

CAST BREAKDOWN: 2

TOPIC: Relationships

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: Matthew 6:12-15

CHURCH YEAR SEASON: Anv

SUGGESTED USE: Bible Study, Family Groups

CHARACTERS:

Maggie — A woman in her 50s Julie – A woman in her early 20s; visibly pregnant

PROPS: 1) Table and chairs to suggest a restaurant

2) Photos

3) Coffee cup

4) Soda cup

5) Two purses

COSTUMES: Contemporary clothing, appropriate to character

SOUND: Two wireless mikes

LIGHTING: General stage; if possible, a spotlight for Mother. When the "blackout" hits, a low level of light should come up. This light should go out when the lighter goes out at the end of the sketch.

SETTING: A restaurant

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MAGGIE and JULIE sit in a restaurant. Photos litter their table. JULIE picks up one, then another, examining them carefully.

MAGGIE: That's me in high school, if you can believe it. Please don't look at the hair. And that's me with my parents. And that's me beating my brother at ... something.

JULIE: You were a tomboy.

MAGGIE: Yes, I was. (*Beat*) That's her in second grade ... and that's her with my mother at the farm. (*Beat*) We should probably order something besides coffee and a soda. The owner is giving us a dirty look.

JULIE: I can't eat.

MAGGIE: Come on. What's your favorite food?

JULIE: I don't know. What's yours?

MAGGIE: Pie. All kinds of pie. Any kind of pie. Except pecan. I'm allergic to most nuts.

JULIE: No. So am I! Wow.

MAGGIE: You're excited because we're both allergic to nuts?

JULIE: I know. (Beat) We've been waiting a long time.

MAGGIE: She'll be here.

JULIE: Maybe she changed her mind. Did she sound like she might change her mind?

MAGGIE: No.

JULIE: Was she angry?

MAGGIE: She's not angry. Just scared. Like you.

JULIE: I don't know. Maybe she's right. I shouldn't have tried to find her. (*Beat*) You know, I really should call Eric. Let him know I made it here.

MAGGIE: How long did you say you've been married?

JULIE: Just a year.

MAGGIE: Got any pictures?

JULIE: Yep. (She digs around in her purse and finds a snapshot.) That's us. Before we got married.
