GENRE: Drama

SYNOPSIS: A young man recently returned from the mission field recalls an encounter with God.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES: Keep it natural. There's no reason to 'overdo' the drama of David's story, so long as it's heartfelt.

COSTUMES: Contemporary

SETTING: A park bench during an Easter egg hunt

Drama Ministry

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Lights up on DAVID, who sits on a park bench watching an Easter egg hunt in progress. LEILA enters after a moment, carrying an Easter basket full of candy and a stuffed bunny.

LEILA: David Sheppard.

DAVID: (Looking up, smiling) Leila Hutchins.

They shake hands warmly and she sits beside him.

LEILA: Welcome back—when'd you get back in town?

DAVID: This morning.

LEILA: What's the time difference between here and East Africa?

DAVID: (Smiling weakly) Let's just say it's past my bedtime.

LEILA: Why aren't you home in bed?

DAVID: Jet lag's got me kinda wired. My body doesn't know whether it's coming or going, so I thought I'd set out here and get some sun. Watch the ole church-sponsored Easter egg hunt.

LEILA: (Extending the Easter basket) Want some chocolate?

DAVID: No thanks. Is that your Easter basket?

LEILA: It's my niece's. But she's two years old—she won't notice a missing peanut butter cup or two. (*Digging in*) Or three.

She takes a bite.

How does America feel after being gone for so long?

DAVID: It's colder than I remember it.

LEILA: That's what you get for sitting on the equator for two years.

DAVID: It's not just the climate. Everything seems colder. Less personal. I don't know. Africa's different.

LEILA: Oh yeah?

DAVID nods and LEILA picks up the small stuffed bunny and speaks into it like a microphone. In a mock interviewer's voice:
