GENRE: Comedy

SYNOPSIS: A single mom and a rabid Star Wars fan face off over an action figure at Christmas time.

DIRECTOR'S TIP: If your church has the ability to use sound effects during this scene, try to pepper the action with Star Wars-like sounds: a lightsaber here and there, Darth Vader breathing, etc. They should be employed only where they won't distract from the action, however.

TOPIC: Materialism

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE: Luke 2:1-20

CHURCH YEAR SEASON: Christmas

SUGGESTED USE: Christmas parties, Christmas shows, Christmas events

CHARACTERS:

Tony—a rabid Star Wars fan
Deanna—a single mom

PROPS: Star Wars action figure in package, purse

COSTUMES: Modern dress; fake tattoo of the symbol for the Rebel Alliance

SOUND: General

LIGHTING: General

SETTING: Toy store

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DEANNA is in a toy aisle, looking at SW figures. She is looking at one in particular. TONY walks down the aisle and sees the figure in her hands, one he really “needs.” He hovers over her shoulder like a vulture. DEANNA turns to face him.

DEANNA: May I help you?

TONY: Oh no, I was just...looking. Star Wars fan?

DEANNA: Me? No, this is for my son. He’s four, and he loves Star Wars. I had to take him to Episode 2 twice. Did you see it?

TONY: Twenty-seven times.

DEANNA: Really? So, what can you tell me about this figure?

TONY: Hmm? Oh, the Darth Maul with split in half action. It’s a kind of rare. I’ve been looking all over for it. Toys R Us, Target, Wal-Mart...

DEANNA: Hmm. Well, it’s the only Darth Maul I’ve found. My son dressed as him for Halloween, and the church wouldn’t allow him into the Halloween alternative party because he looked like a devil. I’m sure he’ll love it.
