What time is it? (Looks at a watch or clock) I'm going to be late for school! Study hall, meet me there! You and me, Jesus!

LUCY exits. Music plays. After a pause, LUCY enters.

LUCY: Oh my gosh, what a day! You would not believe what's going on! Andrew is being a total jerk. He's telling everyone I was controlling, manipulative. As if! I'll tell you who it is—Michael and Robert. They always hated me, and they've convinced him that I'm some psycho who is trying to keep him down. And then to top that off, Veronica's boyfriend was just hitting on me! Oh yeah! The world has gone mad ... or at least the male half of it! (Sighs) Look, sorry to dump on you.
